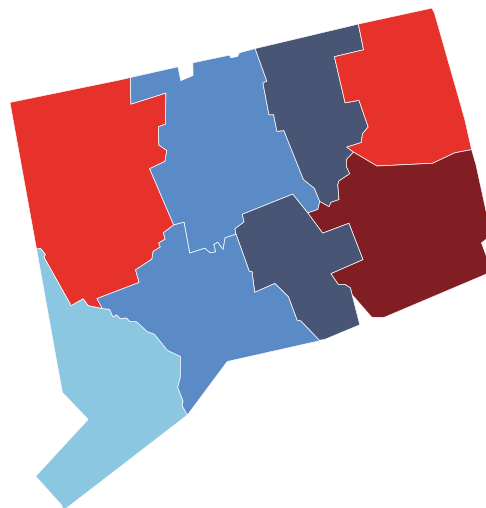

Approximately 43,642 Connecticut veterans live in homes with one or more major problems of quality, crowding, or cost. Housing affordability is the greatest housing problem among veterans. Roughly 31.2 percent of Connecticut veterans pay too much for their housing.

In 2014, 2,341 VA home loan guarantees were made in Connecticut to support veteran homeowners. VA loans represented 4.1 percent of Connecticut's home mortgage originations in 2013.
